COMMON PROBLEM

Logic is not clear.

Check that:

- the objective is derived from the problem;
- the activities clearly link to the objective;
- there is an activity for each output and an output for each activity.





Problem analysis

- Define the core problem,
- describe the causes for the problem,
- tell why is it bad.
- + Justify the problem by statistics, researches etc.



For example:

Justification could be for example accident statistics.











COMMON PROBLEM

Problem should not be defined as lack of something.





Objective is converted from the core problem.

For example:

Objective is not to acquire streetlights even that would be the strategy. Objective is 'improved traffic safety'.





COMMON PROBLEM

Objective should not be a verb. Objective is the change!

You should have only one specific objective.

Improved traffic safety instead of to acquire streetlights, to widen the road and to reduce speeding.





Target groups

Beneficiary = those who benefit from the implementation of the project.

- a. Target group = directly positively affected
- b. Final beneficiary = benefit in the long run (children, consumers)

Be specific enough

Inhabitants of the programme region vs. culture entrepreneurs in Kainuu and Kostomuksha (But don't go too far: Potters from Hyrynsalmi)





Relevance to the priority

Make sure your project contributes to one of the elements of the priority (found from the Guidelines of the Call).

Mention in the application to which you are linking your application to.





Cross-border nature

- Do you have a joint problem or separate ones?
- Is the idea to implement similar activities on both sides of the border? If yes, try to think if things could be done **together**. How could you benefit from each other? Does the other party know/do something better than you?
- Is there added value from CBC?





Activities

 Activities reflect your problem tree's roots – you can't implement activities that are not trying to solve the causes of your core problem.

For example: Planting flowers on the road side is not necessary for improving traffic safety.





Activities

 Check that the proposed activities are convincing and sufficient compared to the objective.

For example?

- 1. Giving torches to the villagers;
- 2. Planting flowers on the roadside;
- 3. Stopping cars and telling them not to speed;
- 4. Organising a traffic safety seminar.









Role and motivation of the partners

- Make sure role and motivation is filled in for all partners.
- Compare the roles and the proposed activities to each other.





Outputs

- The outputs do not come into being by themselves link the outputs to the activities.
- Make sure there is an output for each activity and an activity for each output.
- The outputs need to be relevant for the objective of the project.





Price-quality ratio

- Compare the price tag to the problem you are going to solve and to the objective, not to the activities and outputs.
- Can the project be implemented within shorter duration?





Technical expertise

• Compare the expertise of the partners to the proposed activities: are there activities that can't be implemented by the partners? If yes, explain in activity's description how the activity will be implemented.



Take into account:


Lead partner has to answer YES.

Only LP answers, has to answer YES.










